- Hotel/motel **occupancy** increased 2.8% statewide in January 2012 from January 2011.
 - o US occupancy increased 4.1% in January 2012 from January 2011.
 - o South Atlantic states **occupancy** increased 4.4% in January 2012 from January 2011.
- January 2012 **room rates (ADR)** in North Carolina were up 3.0%.
 - o **Room rates** in the US increased 3.9% from January 2011.
 - o **Room rates** in the South Atlantic states increased 3.6% from January 2011.
- Statewide, **RevPAR** was up 5.9% from January of 2011.
 - o US RevPAR increased 8.1% from January 2011.
