Statewide

- Hotel/motel occupancy increased 4.9% statewide in June 2012 from June 2011.
 - US occupancy increased 4.3% in June 2012 from June 2011.
 - South Atlantic states **occupancy** increased 4.2% in June 2012 from June 2011.
- June 2012 room rates (ADR) in North Carolina were up 4.0%.
 - **Room rates** in the US increased 5.0% from June 2011.
 - **Room rates** in the South Atlantic states increased 3.2% from June 2011.
- Statewide, **RevPAR** was up 9.0% from June of 2011.
 - US RevPAR increased 9.5% from June 2011.
 - South Atlantic **RevPAR** increased 7.5% from June 2011.

- All of the seven economic development regions of the state showed increases in **occupancy** rates for June 2012 from June 2011. In particular, the Triad Region had growth of over thirteen percent
 - Northeast region +1.2% Carolinas region +3.7% Triangle region +1.3%
 - Southeast region +7.6% Triad region +13.2% Western region +4.5%
 - Eastern region +4.4%
- Six of the seven regions experienced increased **ADR** in June 2012 from June 2011. In particular, the Carolinas and Western regions had very positive **ADR** growth. The Eastern Region was down one percent.

- Hotel/motel occupancy is up 3.8% statewide YTD (through June) 2012.
 - The US occupancy is up 3.4% in 2012 from 2011.
 - The South Atlantic states **occupancy** is up 3.1% in 2012 from 2011.
- YTD room rates (ADR) in North Carolina are up 4.0%.
 - The US **ADR** is up 4.4% in 2011 from 2011.
 - The South Atlantic states **ADR** is up 3.3% in 2012 from 2011.
- Statewide, **RevPAR** is up 8.0% year-to-date.
 - Nationally, **RevPAR** is also up 8.0% in 2012 from 2011.
