Statewide

- Hotel/motel **occupancy** increased 0.5% statewide in October 2011 from October 2010.
 - o The US experienced an increase of 2.9% in **occupancy** for the month of October 2011.
 - o The South Atlantic had an increase of 1.4% in **occupancy** in October 2011.
- October 2011 **room rates (ADR)** in North Carolina were up 2.2%.
 - o The US saw an increase in **ADR** of 3.9% from October 2010 to October 2011.
 - o The South Atlantic states' ADR was up 2.3% from October 2010 to October 2011.

 - o **Room supply** in the US increased by 0.6% from October 2010 to October 2011.
 - o **Room supply** in the South Atlantic increased by 0.1% in October 2011.
