# **October 2013** Monthly Lodging Report (Smith Travel Research)

### **Statewide**

- Hotel/motel occupancy increased 2.0% statewide in October 2013 from October 2012.
  - US occupancy increased 0.8% in October 2013 from October 2012.
    - South Atlantic states **occupancy** increased 1.2% in October 2013 from October 2012.
- October 2013 room rates (ADR) in North Carolina were up 3.1%. •
  - **Room rates** in the US increased 3.3% from October 2012.
  - **Room rates** in the South Atlantic states increased 1.8% from October 2012.
- Statewide, **RevPAR** was up 5.2% from October of 2012. .
  - US **RevPAR** increased 4.1% from October 2012.
  - South Atlantic **RevPAR** increased 3.0% from October 2012.
- **Room Supply** increased by 0.9% in the state from October 2012 to October 2013. •
  - US room supply increased 0.7% in October 2013
  - South Atlantic **room supply** was up 0.3% from October 2012 to October 2013.
- Room Demand was up 3.0% in the state from October 2012 to October 2013.
  - Room demand in the US increased 1.5% in October 2013 from October 2012. 0
  - **Room demand** in the South Atlantic increased 1.5% in October 2013 from October 2012.
- North Carolina room revenues increased 6.1% in October 2013.
  - **Room revenues** in the US increased 4.8% from October 2012 to October 2013.
  - **Room revenues** in the South Atlantic increased 3.3% from October 2012 to October 2013.

## Regional

Six of the seven economic development regions showed increases in occupancy rates for October 2013 from October 2012, particularly the Western and Triad regions.

- Hotel/motel occupancy is up 1.0% statewide YTD (through October) 2013.
  - The US occupancy is up 1.4% in 2013 from 2012.  $\cap$
  - The South Atlantic states **occupancy** is up 1.5% in 2013 from 2012. 0
- YTD room rates (ADR) in North Carolina are up 2.0%.
  - The US **ADR** is up 4.0% in 2013 from 2012.
  - The South Atlantic states **ADR** is up 3.0% in 2013 from 2012.
- Statewide, **RevPAR** is up 3.0% year-to-date.
  - Nationally, **RevPAR** is also up 5.4% in 2013 from 2012.
  - The South Atlantic states **RevPAR** is up 4.5% in 2013 from 2012.
- **Room Supply** is up 1.1% in the state year-to-date.
  - Nationally, **room supply** is also up 0.7% in 2013 from 2012.
  - The South Atlantic states **room supply** is up 0.3% in 2013 from 2012. 0
- **Room Demand** is up 2.1% in the state year-to-date. •
  - Nationally, **room demand** is also up 2.1% in 2013 from 2012.
  - The South Atlantic states **room demand** is up 1.8% in 2013 from 2012. 0
- North Carolina **room revenues** are up 4.1% year-to date.
  - Nationally, **room revenues** are also up 6.1% in 2013 from 2012.
  - The South Atlantic states **room revenues** are up 4.9% in 2013 from 2012.

#### Regional

- **Occupancy** in four of the seven economic development regions of the state is up year-to-date (through October), particularly the Western Region (+3.9%). Three of the regions had less than one percent decline in occupancy.
