## **September 2011** Monthly Lodging Report (Smith Travel Research)

#### Statewide

- Hotel/motel **occupancy** increased 6.8% statewide in September 2011 from September 2010.
  - o The US experienced an increase of 5.7% in **occupancy** for the month of September 2011.
  - o The South Atlantic had an increase of 6.2% in **occupancy** in September 2011.
- September 2011 **room rates** (**ADR**) in North Carolina were up 3.3%.
  - o The US saw an increase in **ADR** of 4.0% from September 2010 to September 2011.
  - o The South Atlantic states' ADR was up 2.9% from September 2010 to September 2011.
- Statewide, **RevPAR** was up 10.3% from September of 2010.
  - o Nationally, **RevPAR** was up 10.0% for the month of September.
  - o **RevPAR** in the South Atlantic states was up 9.4% during this time frame.
- North Carolina **room revenues** increased 11.2% in September 2011.
  - o Nationally, **room revenues** were up 10.7% from September 2010
  - o South Atlantic states' **room revenues** were up 9.6% from September 2010.
- **Room Demand** increased 7.6% in the state from September 2010 to September 2011.
  - o **Room demand** in the US increased by 6.4% in September 2011.
  - o **Room demand** in the South Atlantic increased by 6.4% in September 2011.
- Room Supply increased by 0.8% in the state from September 2010 to September 2011.
  - o **Room supply** in the US increased by 0.6% from September 2010 to September 2011.
  - o **Room supply** in the South Atlantic increased by 0.2% in September 2011.

## **Regional**

• Six of the seven economic development regions of the state showed increases in **occupancy** rates for September 2011 from September 2010. Only the Southeast Region had a slight decrease from last August (-0.6%). The Northeast and Eastern regions had substantial growth from September 2010 to September 2011.

- YTD **room rates** (**ADR**) in North Carolina are up 2.3%.
  - o The US **ADR** is up 3.6% in 2011 from 2010.

- Statewide, **RevPAR** is up 7.0% year-to-date.
